



State Vaccination Requirements





- State laws establish vaccination requirements for school children.
- These laws often apply to public schools, private schools and day care facilities.
- All states provide medical exemptions, and some state offer exemptions for religious and/or philosophical reasons.
- Requirements are tools for maintaining high vaccination coverage rates.
- State laws also establish mechanisms for enforcement.
- Different documentation, signatures, etc. depending on the state.






IL Vaccination Requirements

- accepted by the state as proof of immunization.
- Specific form required for a religious exemptions.
- A parental signature is required for a religious exemption.
- BOTH exemptions require a medical practitioner's signature.
- Provider must specify a condition or other medical reason that prevents the student from being vaccinated for a medical exemption.
- No additional documentation required for either exemption.

Exemptions

- The AAP views nonmedical exemptions to school-required immunizations as inappropriate for individual, public health, and ethical reasons and advocates for their elimination.
 - ► Higher rates of immunization exemptions in communities correlate with higher rates of vaccine-preventable illnesses and disease outbreaks, such as pertussis and measles.
- Personal Belief Exemptions for Vaccination Put
 People at Risk. Examine the Evidence for Yourself.



How a Bill Becomes a Law




How a Bill Becomes a Law

Bill is drafted and sent to Leg. Reference Bureau (LRB)

Referred to rules & assigned to committee (1st Reading)

- Committee Hearing
 - Either pass as is, amend bill and pass, or do not pass
 - Testify in person, written or "slip"





Read on floor for Second Reading

- Can be amended
- Read on floor for Third Reading Vote!
 - If passed, sent to second chamber



History of Vaccine Legislation





- Jacobson versus Massachusetts: found legislative vaccine mandates to be constitutional as a means of protecting public health and public safety.
- Zucht versus King (1922): the Supreme Court upheld a local ordinance requiring vaccination as a condition for school attendance.
 ¹⁷
- Prince versus Commonwealth of Massachusetts (1944): the constitutional rights of religion or parenthood were not beyond limitation - states had the authority to protect the welfare of children and the community.

National AAP COVID-19 Vaccine Priorities

Illinois Chapter



- Longer invoice & payment schedules so pediatricians can be reimbursed before purchasing additional vaccines.
- Simplified and improved labeling of COVID-19 vials to minimize errors in administration.
- Easier return process for expired doses.
- Single-dose vials for all products.

What's Going on Now

Illinois Chapter



- April: a US District Court judge issued a preliminary injunction barring Mississippi from enforcing its medical only exemption to school entry immunization requirements
 - Directed the state to create a religious exemption.
- April: A bill to expand nonmedical exemptions was defeated
 - No state has expanded nonmedical exemptions through an act of the legislature since 2003

Increased VFC vaccine administration rate from \$6.40 to \$16.71 for Medicaid fee-for-service (FFS) and the HealthChoice Illinois (HCI) managed care plans (birth through 18) – effective 7/1/22


